The 19th annual X-SIGHTment Run in Colleyville on Saturday, June 4, attracted some fast runners who were enticed by the purse of \$250 being offered to the top overall male and female finishers. Others were enticed by the promise of pancakes that have become a staple of this great event.

Easily taking the top spot with a finish time of 16:20 was 21-year-old Kyle Scanlan, the winner of last week's Knights of Columbus 5K in Fort Worth.

Scanlan has a PR of 14:40 for the 3.1-mile distance. The athlete recently graduated from Baylor with a double major in supply chain management and information systems.

On the female side, another Baylor grad came out on top as 22-year-old Bree Schrader easily snagged the overall title with her time of 18:47. Schrader has a PR of 17:40 in the 5K. She incorporates weight training in her weekly routine and can squat lift her body weight.

As the X-SIGHTment run was the third and final race in the inaugural Colleyville Championship series organized by the Colleyville Chamber of Commerce, cash prizes were awarded to six runners who accumulated the most points in the races. Claiming the overall male title and \$300 was James Jackson who, at age 49, is still giving high school athletes a run for their money. I was thrilled to win the overall female award. The cash prize was greatly appreciated and will help pay for my weeks of physiotherapy! Randy Bobe and Christina Signorelli finished second overall, pocketing \$150 each while Ken Hall and Sarah Cloud finished third and took home \$75 each.
